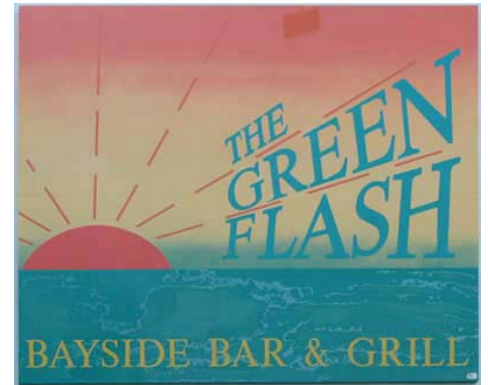

## Update from your Marco Bay Cruising Team for 2013.

We have attempted to create a cruising calendar for the 2013 Cruising Season which will take into account the many club events and other happenings on the island, yet be interesting and desirable for boaters and those without boats.

For January, Rick Geschrei has put together a cruise to The Pink Shell Resort on Fort Myers Beach (a brand new facility), and then on to Tarpon Point on Cape Coral. Tarpon Point Marina is located within a relatively new community. First begun in 2007, the marina is well laid out, featuring fixed docks, fuel, free pump out, nearby deli, and two restaurants; Marker 92, and the Nauti Mermaid. Adjacent to the Marina is a major hotel run by Starwood's Westin chain. **Call directly to Pink Shell or the Westin if you need accommodations.**

For February, the Brinkoettters and the Geschreis have put together a cruise to South Seas on Captiva Island and on to Boca Grande Marina on Gasparilla Island. South Seas is one of the best cruising destinations in Florida, and Boca Grande one of the most historically interesting destinations in SW Florida. Rent a golf cart available at the marina and explore the island. Be sure to drive down the lane where the banyan trees create a tunnel effect. Explore the southern portion of the island along the beach and stop at South Beach Bar and Grill and enjoy lunch. Have dinner at the Eagle Grille at the Marina, and/or the Pink Elephant in town. **If accommodations are needed, please call directly to South Seas Resort at South Seas, or the Boca Grande Resort, or the Gasparilla Inn on Boca Grande.**

For March, Ginny Rapp, Brent Cook, Bob Herndon, and Mike Brown have put together a two-part cruise to some of our favorite destinations. We leave for our first destination, South Seas Marina, then on to Marina Jack in Sarasota. Part of the cruisers will then return to Marco, stopping at Palm Island on the inland route home. The remaining cruisers will travel from Sarasota to Saint Petersburg Municipal Marina in Saint Petersburg, and eventually return to Marco Island via a stop at Crow's Nest in Venice. Marina Jack is a delightful destination. Located adjacent to downtown Sarasota, we have access to all that Sarasota offers: food, theatre, shopping, Ringling Brothers Headquarters, etc. Same for St. Pete, a cosmopolitan city and all it entails including interesting museums, including the Dali Museum and the restored Vinoy Resort. **Please call directly for accommodations in Sarasota to either the Hyatt, or the Ritz Carleton, within a half-mile of Marina Jack; or the Hotel Indigo or the Wellesley Hotel, both within one mile. In St. Pete, call directly to the Hampton Inn, or the Hilton, or the Vinoy, all within a few blocks of the St. Pete Municipal Marina.**

For April/May, we are still researching where to go. We may cruise through Lake Okeechobee to the east coast, stopping at Roland Martin's Marina in Clewiston, Sunset Harbor Marina in Stuart, and Palm Harbor Marina in West Palm. We may continue south, stopping in Fort Lauderdale, Miami, Ocean Reef, Marathon and back to Marco. Some cruisers may want to return via the "ditch" and forgo completing the loop. More to come on this cruise.
