

LAST HURRAH CRUISE May 5-11, 2013

After several communications between Brent and the other cruisers (Gelfands, Grahams, Coffins, Skillerns, and Mulligans concerning weather and sea conditions, the group finally left Marco, albeit a day later than planned. Following are the rest of Brent Cook's notes on their trip.

5/5/13 I have just spoken to each of you by phone but want to confirm, for those of you who sounded groggy (Frank) that our cruise departure has been postponed until 9:30 am at R2 on Monday. It looks like winds and seas will be somewhat better tomorrow.

When I can talk to the Marinas, the intent is to go to Fisherman's Village for overnight on Monday and Tuesday, then to Legacy for overnight on Wednesday and Thursday, returning to Marco as scheduled on Friday. I will update you again later today and, if necessary, make a final determination early tomorrow morning.

5/5/13 The latest NOAA forecast shows that we have a break in the wind speed tomorrow dropping from 15 kts today to around 10 kts tomorrow and that the winds shift overnight from NW to mostly west and very slight SW. Seas along the shoreline are forecast to be around 2' rather than 3' today. The dockmaster at the Marina at Fisherman's Village was not the least bit surprised by us pushing our arrival back a day and will be flexible if there are other changes. I will wait to contact Legacy Marina until we are on our way tomorrow. Our departure Monday morning has been pushed back to 10:00 am from R2.

5/5/13 Weather for tomorrow is looking fairly decent with seas near shore running 1' to 2' and mostly West winds 8 to 9 kts. Unless something major changes, we will meet at R2 at 10:00 am. In the event of poor seas on Friday, is there anyone other than Mulligans that HAVE to be home on Friday?

5/6/13 The Last Hurrah cruisers arrived at Fisherman's Village at 1:00 after a lumpy ride to San Carlos Bay, then a very smooth second half. All is good here!

5/8/13 Last Hurrah Cruisers departed Fisherman's Village at 9:45 this morning in very calm (Paula) seas, enjoyed the view on a passing sailboat, and arrived at Legacy Marina at 12:30 pm. Following a late lunch at Joe's Crab Shack, we are anxiously awaiting a late dinner tonight at The Veranda! After 30 minute car ride, where they burned slightly over a gallon of gas, we wee met at Legacy by Frank and Marianne. The Girls are at the Tiki Hut playing cards, and the guys are relaxing near the pool. Charlie Skillern has determined that we have way too much fun on these cruises!

5/10/13 Our group had decided that we are having so much fun, doing nothing, then eating again, that we are extending our stay at Legacy Marina one more day and will head home tomorrow. Sad to say that the Mulligans will be leaving in their Land Yacht today and gambling away the money they saved on boat fuel at the Hard Rock in Miami tonight. Good luck Marianne!

He served our Club in many different capacities, including serving as Commodore in half of 2002 and again in 2003. Dave's leadership, positive attitude, and boundless energy will be missed by all of us who had the honor to know him.

Past Commodore David E. Brandt, Jr

David E. Brandt, Jr., 87, of Marco Island, FL, beloved husband and father, departed this life on April 24th, 2013. He was born in Jacksonville, FL, to David Elliott Brandt, Sr. and his wife Mary.

He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Margaret D'Ann; two sons, and one grandson. Sons are David and his wife Mary of Belton, TX, and Richard, his wife Nancy, and son James of Puyallup, WA.

A mechanical engineer graduate of the University of Florida, Dave was an aeronautical engineer with a passion for jet engines. His career with Westinghouse and General Electric took him across the U.S. and overseas, where he and D'Ann made lifelong friends.

In retirement, Dave was proud to serve his community as a member of the first Marco Island City Council and as Commodore of the Marco Bay Yacht Club. He was also appointed by then-governor Jeb Bush to fill a vacant seat on the Collier County Commission. After his son Rick was injured in a car accident, Dave devoted long hours to improving the lives of those with head injuries and established the Center for Independent Living in Fort Myers.

A memorial service was held at St. Mark's Episcopal Church on May 14th at 10:00 a.m.
