NOTICE

The shoals near Cape Romano known as "Second Chance" have been designated as an official CRITICAL WILDLIFE AREA by the FWC.

- The sandbar is **closed to public access**
- No vessels or people, swimming or wading
 - **March 1 - August 31 ANNUALLY**



Q: When did this happen?

A: The designation became official in December, 2015.

Q: Will the shoals be closed permanently?

A: No. The emergent portion of the shoal, which is the sandbar known locally as "Second Chance," will be closed for nesting season from March through August, annually.


Q: How do human activities impact the area?

A: People walking, shelling, fishing, or observing birds near the breeding colony will cause the birds to flush.

Q: How is the area impacted by boaters?

A: People fishing from their boats, or operating any watercraft near the nesting area at any speed can cause disturbance.
